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1 Summary

An archaeological evaluation (five trial-trenches) was carried out at land to the rear of Windy Ridge, Colne Road, Bures Hamlet, Essex in advance of the construction of nine new detached dwellings. The evaluation revealed four undated ditches, a probable post-medieval ditch and an undated natural feature/treethrow.

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This is the archive report for an archaeological evaluation by trial-trenching on land to the rear of Windy Ridge, Colne Road, Bures Hamlet, Essex which was carried out on 31st July to 1st August 2017. The work was commissioned by Davis Syrett on behalf of Balkerne Gate Developments (Southeast) Ltd in advance of the construction of nine detached dwellings, and was carried out by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation with Essex County Council Place Services (ECCPS), Historic Environment Advisor Teresa O'Connor advised that, in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with the *National Planning Policy Framework* (DCLG 2012).

All archaeological work was carried out in accordance with a *Brief for archaeological trial-trenching and excavation*, detailing the required archaeological work, written by Teresa O'Connor (ECCPS 2017), and a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) prepared by CAT in response to the brief and agreed with ECCPS (CAT 2017).

In addition to the brief and WSI, all fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with English Heritage's *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment* (*MoRPHE*) (English Heritage 2006), and with *Standards for field archaeology in the East of England* (EAA **14** and **24**). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standard and guidance for archaeological field evaluation* (CIfA 2014a) and *Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials* (CIfA 2014b).


3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological background draws on the Essex Historic Environment Record (EHER) held at Essex County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, Essex.

The EHER shows that the development site lies within a landscape containing a number of cropmark features that are suggestive of prehistoric burial features. Ringditches are known to occur along the margins of the River Colne and these areas are thought to have been significant in prehistoric burial practices. Cropmarks occur 300-400m to the SW (EHER 9281 and 9480, two ring-ditches and linear features), *c* 500m to the SE/SSE (EHER 9191, three ring-ditches) and 640m SSW (EHER 9838, linear and curvilinear cropmarks).

To the north lies the historic settlement of Bures which originated in the medieval period and less than 200m directly west lies Parsonage Farm, a 15th-century hall house which is a Grade II* listed building. The house would have probably been built on the site of the medieval manor.

A significant number of finds from all periods has been recovered from fields surrounding the historic settlement. The railway appears on the 1st edition map along the eastern boundary of the site and goods sheds and associated railway buildings were erected along the line adjacent to the station. A footpath, depicted on the 1st edition OS crossed the railway line and formed the northern boundary of the site. The route may have been in use prior to the surveying and publication of this map.

4 **Results** (Figs 2-3)

Five trial-trenches were excavated within the development site. Three layers were recorded. Modern topsoil (L1, c 0.05-0.25m thick, soft moist dark grey/brown sandy-loam with charcoal, fleck and tile fleck inclusions and frequent stones) sealed accumulated subsoil (L2, c 0.06-0.27m thick, firm dry medium yellow-grey-brown sandy-silt with charcoal, brick, tile and manganese fleck inclusions and occasional stones). This layer sealed naturally-deposited sands and soils (L3, of firm dry light-to-dark yellow-orange-brown sandy-silty-clay, encountered at a depth of c 0.15-0.48m below current ground level).

Trench 1 (T1): 30m long by 1.8m wide

No significant archaeological remains were uncovered within this trench.

Trench 2 (T2): 30m long by 1.8m wide

Undated ditch F3 was aligned northwest-southeast and measured 0.58m in width and 0.1m in depth. The feature probably continues to the southeast as ditch F4 in T4. Possible post-medieval ditch F5 was also uncovered. It wa aligned northwest-southeast, measured 1.33m in width and 0.42m in depth. It cut through undated ditch F6 which was also aligned northwest-southeast, and measured 1.12m in width and 0.35m in depth.

Trench 3 (T3): 30m long by 1.8m wide

Undated natural feature or tree-throw F2 was uncovered. It measured 0.72m in width and 0.1m in depth.

Trench 4 (T4): 30m long by 1.8m wide

Undated ditch F4 was aligned northwest-southeast and measured 0.45m in width and 0.1m in depth. It probably continues to the northwest as ditch F3 in T2.

Trench 5 (T5): 30m long by 1.8m wide

Undated ditch F1 was aligned northeast-southwest and measured 1.2m in width and 0.12m in depth.

5 Finds

The only finds came from the fill of F5 (1) in T2. The most closely-dated is a broken piece from the end of a post-medieval pottery land drain of arched shape with an open base (192 g). A small abraded piece of fired clay (62 g) was also recovered from the feature. This has a fine sand fabric with dark grey core and oxidised surfaces. It is not closely-datable but is likely to be residual. A natural piece (flake) of flint with mottled

patinated surfaces and an unpatinated area of rough damage on one face was also retrieved from the fill.

6 Discussion

Archaeological evaluation at this site revealed four undated ditches, a probable postmedieval ditch, and an undated natural feature/tree-throw. It is possible that the ditches represent the remains of old field boundaries, though none are indicated in historic maps of the site.










Fig 3 Feature sections



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




Fig 4 Representative sections
