1 Summary

Archaeological monitoring was carried out at 7 Common Road, Stock during the demolition of the existing house and erection of the first of two new houses with associated parking and groundworks. Monitoring was primarily undertaken to determine the relationship of the site to the historic pottery industry of Stock. No significant archaeological remains were encountered as excavations did not penetrate beyond modern layers. Nor was any residual evidence of pottery manufacture uncovered.

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This report presents the results of archaeological monitoring at 7 Common Road, Stock, which was carried out on 13th March 2018. The work was commissioned by Anthony O'Toole of E&M Design on behalf of March Building Contracts during the demolition of the existing house and erection of the first of two new houses with associated parking and groundworks and was undertaken by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation, Essex County Council Historic Environment Advisor (ECCHEA) Alison Bennett advised that in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with the *National Planning Policy Framework* (DCLG 2012).

All archaeological work was carried out in accordance with the *Brief for monitoring and recording at 7 Common Road, Stock* detailing the required archaeological work, written by Alison Bennett (ECCPS 2018), and a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) prepared by CAT in response to the brief and agreed with ECCHEA (CAT 2018).

In addition to the brief and WSI, all fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with English Heritage's *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE)* (English Heritage 2006), and with *Standards for field archaeology in the East of England* (EAA **14** and **24**). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standard and guidance for archaeological watching briefs* (CIfA 2014a) and *Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials* (CIfA 2014b).

3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological background draws on the Essex Historic Environment Record (EHER) held at Essex County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, Essex.

Pottery manufacture was an important industry in Stock from the 16th to the 19th centuries. This has been evidenced by the finding of post-medieval pottery kilns to the north-west of the development site at Stock Bowling Club (EHER 5507), and medieval pottery and kiln waste came from a sewer trench alongside Common Lane (EHER 5391). Recent excavations at 10 The Paddock revealed large quantities of post medieval pottery, which indicates a nearby kiln (CAT Report 704, EHER 48334). Historical evidence shows that Stock Common to the northwest of the development site was dug for clay for pottery manufacture. Earlier evidence of occupation in Stock comes from a site to the south of the development site (EHER 46565) where Late Bronze Age/Early Iron Age features were found.

For further details of the history of Stock see Phillips (2003).

4 Aims

Archaeological monitoring was primarily undertaken to ascertain the relationship of this site, if any, to the pottery industry of medieval and post-medieval Stock. More generally,

monitoring was carried out to identify and record any surviving archaeological deposits that may exist on the site.




Fig 2 Monitoring results

5 Results (Figs 2-3)

On 13th March 2018, a CAT archaeologist observed the removal of the slab and foundations of the former dwelling at this site and the levelling of an area measuring 263m² by 0.5m below current ground level in preparation for the construction of a piling mat.

Two horizons were observed during the area reduction. A modern concrete foundation slab (L1, *c* 0.3-0.4m thick, concrete layer overlaying a bed of dark grey brown sandy silt) sealed modern topsoil (L2, dark grey brown silty clay).

Substantial modern truncation was apparent during the area reduction. This was the result of the removal of the foundations of the former dwelling. Modern debris (tile, brick and plastic) was observed compressed into L2 (likely a result of the demolition works) but not retained. No archaeological material or deposits were observed during the groundworks.

6 Finds

There were no archaeological finds.

7 Conclusion

Archaeological monitoring at this site did not detect any residual trace of the pottery manufacturing industry of medieval and post-medieval Stock. However, as groundworks did not penetrate beyond modern layers, it cannot be definitively concluded that this site was not implicated in this activity.



Fig 1 Site location.
